

DENR clarifies issues on Manila Bay rehabilitation

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) maintains that the dolomite that was overlayed on the portion of the Manila Bay as part of its beach nourishment project was not washed out, but was only covered by black sand caused by recent rains. “There is no truth to the news reports that the dolomite sand has already been washed out to the sea,” said DENR Undersecretary for Policy, Planning and International Affairs Jonas R. Leones. Leones made the clarification in response to the news reports quoting him that “about 10 percent of the dolomite sand in Manila Bay has been swept to sea by the heavy rains.” According to the DENR official, the dolomite has been washed in by black sand but it is still intact. “Ang two layers ninyan ay regular black sand. Ang top layer ay dolomite. Yung water kapag nagkaroon ng malakas na wave, nadadala iyung black sand dun sa dolomite”. He clarified that the washed in dolomite “will not be washed out to the sea because of the geo-engineering intervention we put on the project.” “Besides, the project is still with the contractor. They are still liable in conducting measures for the project,” Leones explained. He added: “We stand by our public that we will protect the people’s money.” Source: DENR

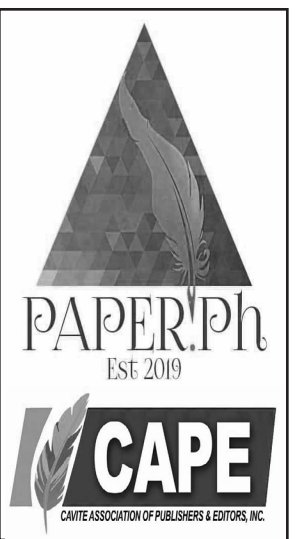

DILG to resume Road-clearing on Nov. 16 with a 60 day period

After more than seven months of suspension, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) has announced the resumption of the Road-Clearing Operation 2.0 (RCO 2.0) depending on the quarantine classification of the local government units (LGUs), giving 60 calendar days for local governments to comply with the Presidential directive.

DILG Secretary Eduardo M. Año said that with the flattened COVID-19 curve and improved quarantine classification in various areas of the country, RCO 2.0 will officially commence on November 16 until January 15, 2021 giving LGUs ample time to comply. “Sisimulan na po ulit ang road clearing starting November 16. We hope that the LGUs, despite the COVID-19 pandemic, will show the same enthusiasm and positive results that they were able to achieve last year as we aim for safer and accessible roads free from illegal and potentially hazardous encroachments,” Año said. “Despite the January 15 deadline, we wish to remind the LGUs that RCO is year-long endeavor, kaya kailangan natin ang kanilang commitment at pakikiisa,” he added. Early this week, President Rodrigo Duterte placed the entire National Capital Region and other areas of the country on General Community Quarantine (GCQ) for the whole month of November with no region in the country placed under the strictest community quarantine classification. Through DILG Memorandum Circular 2020-145, Año said though the resumption of RCO 2.0 will vary, in different degrees, depending on the quarantine classification of a certain area. “We may have resumed RCO 2.0 but we acknowledge (Turn to page 2)

(From page 1) He said that full implementation of the RCO executed by LGUs under 2.0 will be enforced in GCQ while in areas under MGCQ and der MECQ and ECQ, the the New Normal or Post RCOs are suspended. Quarantine Scenario. Par-LGUs and barangays

under a localized ECQ or MECQ may likewise suspend the implementation of RCO 2.0 regardless of their community quarantine classification.

In the said memorandum, Año said that partial implementation in areas under GCQ is limited to the actual removal or abatement of road and sidewalk obstructions that are considered dangerous to motorists and pedestrians and road clearing for the purpose of establishing bike lanes. Full implementation in MGCQ areas and below, he said, requires LGUs to adopt all components of the RCO as provided by DILG Memorandum Circular 2020-027.

All LGUs implementing RCO 2.0, according to Año, whether partial or full implementation, are expected to abide by the prescription of DILG Memorandum Circular 2020-027 released by the Department last February stipulating the policy on the continued implementation of the President's order to clear roads of illegal obstructions. Ridding streets of obstructions DILG Secretary Año said that during the 60-day implementation of the RCO 2.0, LGUs must rid the streets of any obstruction as provided by DILG MC 2020-027. "We maintain the same resolve and principle as when we started this campaign. Ito po ay para sa kaginhawahan ng ating mga mamamayan and we expect the LGUs down to the barangays to

deliver." According to the said memorandum, road obstructions such as vehicular terminals except in areas designated by the LGUs; vending sites; house encroachments that obstruct the right-of-way; debris, waste materials, and other junked items, among others must be cleared off roadways.

Meanwhile, DILG Undersecretary and Spokesperson Jonathan E. Malaya said that during the course of the implementation of the RCO 2.0, parked ambulance and public emergency vehicles; checkpoints established by IATF, LGUs, PNP, and AFP; and temporary obstructions caused by the establishment of bike lanes

quickly adapt and respond to the pandemic," said Assistant Secretary Mahilum-West.

Assistant Secretary Mahilum-West offered prospects for the region amid trends brought about by the pandemic, namely:

(1) accelerated digitalization prompting discussions on cybersecurity and the need to narrow the digital gap;

(2) the role of the

Master Plan on ASEAN Connectivity 2025 in the way the region will bounce back;

(3) the potential of sub-regional development groupings;

(4) heightened focus on the environment and climate change, and the work of the ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity;

(5) upscaling the labor force and the role of the ASEAN TVET Council in enhancing competitive-

ness of human resources; and

(6) the importance of ASEAN Centrality through mechanisms such as the East Asia Summit, the ASEAN Regional Forum, and the Regional Comprehensive Partnership Agreement which is awaited to be signed this year, among others.

She highlighted the ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific, which is based on the principles of ASEAN Centrality, inclusive-

ness, consensus-building, and utilizing diplomatic approaches in conflict resolution, for promoting cooperation in the Indo-Pacific region.

The meeting also underlined the crucial importance of multilateralism in tackling traditional and emerging transboundary issues such as COVID-19.

Other panelists included German Ambassador to the Philippines Anke Reiffenstuel and Australian Centre Professor Brendan lian National University's Taylor. Source: DFA

are exempted from being removed or apprehended.

Structures or obstructions erected for locally stranded individuals, Malaya said, must also be removed upon their return to their intended LGU destination.

He also said that banning of motorized pedicabs and tricycles on national roads and highways must be implemented by the LGUs notwithstanding the rules and guidelines

set by the Department of

Transportation on the operation of tricycles during the community quarantine period. DILG Validation of LGU compliance, just like in the previous implementation of RCO, Malaya said, will be exercised in the provincial, municipal, and city levels on January 18-22, 2021. LGUs that fail to comply with the presidential directive will face administrative charges from the DILG.
