DENR and MAP join hands to improve PH climate action

The priority thrusts of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources have recognized new support as the department closes a deal with a long-established management organization in the Philippines to strengthen efforts in attaining global climate goals. DENR and the business group Management Association of the Philippines (MAP) joined hands through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding. (Turn to page 3)



Cayetano pushes for DOLE, DBM inclusion in Education Cabinet Cluster

Senator Alan Peter Cayetano suggested the inclusion of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) in the proposed creation of a new Cabinet Cluster focused on education.

Cayetano, serving as co-chairperson of the Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM II), and other commissioners submitted the proposal to President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. on June 27, 2024.

This move aims to address the persistent learning crisis in the coun-

try by ensuring "strong coordination among key departments and agencies involved in education and workforce development."

Established by Republic Act 11899 in July 2022, EDCOM II is mandated to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of the Philippine education system and propose transformative policies to address ongoing challenges in education and the labor market.

The proposal underscores the need for a dedicated Cabinet Cluster to urgently tackle the learning crisis and formulate a cohesive national educa-

tion and workforce development plan.

Cayetano, who also chairs the Senate Committee on Higher, Technical and Vocational Education, emphasized the importance of DOLE and DBM's inclusion in ensuring sustained operational funding and alignment with workforce development goals.

Drawing from historical precedent, EDCOM II referenced the 1991 EDCOM report, which led to significant reforms including the establishment of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and the Technical Education and Skills Development Au-

thority (TESDA).

The current proposal aims to build upon these past efforts by promoting coordinated planning, monitoring educational

outcomes, aligning teacher education, and meeting the evolving needs of the job market.

Dedicated to bringing about meaningful

change in the Philippine education system, Cayetano and EDCOM II are hopeful that the proposal garners the necessary support.

DSWD to amp up 4Ps

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) stays committed to uplifting the lives and welfare of every Filipino by investing in human capital, a senior official of the agency said on Friday (July 19) following the latest result of the Social Weather Stations (SWS) survey.

Based on the 2nd Quarters SWS survey conducted from June 23-July 1, about 58% of families

rated themselves as poor; 12% considered themselves borderline; and about 30% said they are not poor.

The self-rated poor families in the June-July survey was 12 points above the 46% in March 2024.

"Secretary Rex Gatchalian always says ending poverty will not happen overnight. We, in the department, believe that investing in human

capital is one of the keys to improving the productivity of one's self, helping them to become a productive member of society that can be translated into improvements in living standards," Asst. Secretary Irene Dumlao, who is also the DSWD spokesperson, said.

To realize the goal of uplifting the lives of the vulnerable, Asst. Secretary Dumlao reiterated that the

(From page 6) business environment, and investments in defense and airport infrastructure to attract further investments in the aerospace sector.

Beyond aerospace, the Philippines also sets its sights on the burgeoning electric vehicle (EV) market.

The government's strategy encompasses the entire EV ecosystem, from green metals mining and processing to battery production, EV assembly, and

charging infrastructure. Leveraging the country's electronics expertise, the Philippines seeks to become a central hub for automotive electronics manufacturing.

Moreover, the Philippines is expanding beyond manufacturing and hardware, with a flourishing Information Technology and Business Process Management (IT-BPM) sector set for growth.

Through the Tatak Pinoy Act, the DTI seeks

to upgrade the IT-BPM sector towards higher-value services like engineering service outsourcing, software development, AI and data science, and game development.

Alongside its technological strength, the DTI nurtures a dynamic creative economy, targeting for the Philippines to be Asia's top creative hub by 2030.

The DTI's strategy focuses on developing four

DSWD continuously improves the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps), the agency's flagship poverty alleviation program.

Secretary Gatchalian earlier announced that President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr has greenlighted two additional enhancements for the 4Ps to protect the beneficiaries from inflation and mitigate malnutrition and stunting among children.

"The DSWD is starting to revisit the policy of the 4Ps to add inflation proofing. Since the law was enacted in 2019, the cash grant that beneficiaries receive is still the same. With this, we can protect our beneficiaries from the rising inflation," the DSWD spokesperson pointed out.

The agency will also include the 'First 1000-day grant' which will provide supplementary cash grants for female beneficiaries who are pregnant and nursing mothers to further improve the health and nutrition of their children during the critical first 1,000 days.


"Aside from these enhancements, we are partnering with different agencies to ensure the financial security and sustainability of our 4Ps beneficiaries as they graduate and transition out of the program," Asst. Secretary Dumlao pointed out.

Earlier this month, the DSWD signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the state-run Social Security System (SSS) to formalize the provision of low-cost social insurance for the 4Ps beneficiaries who may one day become SSS pensioners.

As part of the DSWD's commitment to President Marcos' digital transformation agenda, the agency also collaborated with different private agencies, including online payment portals, to digitize the payout systems of 4Ps and other programs.

According to the DSWD spokesperson, 4Ps monitored children are also excelling in their studies, making them licensed professional teachers, engineers, midwives, among others. "There are also topnotchers in board examinations. These accomplishments highlight the positive impact of the 4Ps on the educational attainment of its beneficiaries. They are solid evidence that DSWD's 4Ps is a valuable tool in effectively investing in human capital," Asst. Secretary Dumlao said.

The 4Ps aims to break the intergenerational cycle of poverty by investing in human capital. The program provides cash grants to improve their health, nutrition, and education, particularly for those 0-18 years old. Source: DSWD

Complementing creative industry clusters: CAIR, the DTI is establishing an Industry 4.0 Pilot Factory and Industry 4.0 SME Academy. These initiatives aim to accelerate the adoption of Industry 4.0 technologies such as intelligent robotics, automation, Internet of Things, and smart factory solutions in the manufacturing sector. In parallel, the DTI is nurturing a vibrant startup ecosystem to drive entrepreneurship and innovation. In partnership with Plug and Play Philippines, the Department launched the National Startup Accelerator Program at the Manila Tech Sphere. This initiative aims to enhance the quality and quantity of local startups, connect them with corporations, and attract investments. Enhancing its innovation capabilities, the DTI is also collaborating with the Asian Development Bank on the Promoting Research and Innovation to Strengthen Transformation of Industries and Enterprises (PRISTINE) Project. This initiative is designed to accelerate the commercialization of research and development projects, particularly those originating from universities, and facilitate their successful entry into the market. Building on all these efforts outlined in its industrialization strategy, supported by the Tatak Pinyon Act, the DTI is set to unveil the National Innovation Gateway by 2027. This will be a dynamic convergence platform for regional innovation hubs that will elevate

the Philippine brand of innovation on the global stage and position Manila as a premier destination for collaboration and progress. In line with the Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028, the Tatak Pinyon (Proudly Filipino) Act is a key component of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s industrial policy. Enacted last February 26, this focuses on fostering the manufacturing of diverse, sophisticated, and high-quality products and services. Furthermore, this law underscores the government's dedication to establish robust partnerships between public and private sectors that drive collaborative progress towards national development goals. "We recognize that government cannot achieve this vision alone. We need a whole-of-nation approach, the cooperation and active participation of all stakeholders—from the private sector, academe, development partners, and civil society organizations."

standing (MOU) held in Makati City on June 12 to boost the country's climate actions and submission to international and national

policies and agreements by supporting the department's prime thrusts, specifically clean air, carbon emission inventory, solid waste management, and

the National Greening Program, as well as the country's hosting of the 2024 Asia Pacific Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (APMC-DRR).

"The MOU we signed today is an affirmation of our shared commitment to pursuing the agenda of building a resilient Philippines and Asia Pacific Region," said DENR Secretary Maria Antonia Yulo Loyzaga.

Under the partnership, MAP will conduct information, education, and communications campaigns among MAP members and pursue advocacy programs on the DENR's

major initiatives. MAP is a 74-year-old management organization, comprising of 1,100 members, including a diverse group of Chief Executive Officers (CEOs), Chief Operating Officers (COOs), and other top executives from leading local and multinational companies in the Philippines.

Its extensive industry experience will help bring awareness on the ground about environmental issues in the country and nationwide. The group will also hold general membership meetings where representatives from the DENR will serve as resource persons, providing insights

and information on environmental issues and related topics. These meetings aim to foster a deeper understanding and active participation among members in initiatives addressing environmental challenges. The MOU serves as a prelude to the Philippines' hosting of the Asia-Pacific Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (APMCDRR) where MAP members will also be encouraged to collaborate and participate.

Set to be held from October 14 to 17, 2024, the APMCDRR is the biennial conference that will convene global leaders to collectively address challenges

es and accelerate progress in disaster risk reduction.

This will be spearheaded by the DENR, Department of National Defense, together with the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction.

"Our partnership is a commitment to accelerating real change and a recognition that though we may take different paths toward our collective goals of building a resilient Philippines, we remain united in purpose," the environment chief said. dengue cases have been reported from the start of 2024 until June 29, with 233 deaths in the same time period.

The number of cases this year is 19% higher than the previous year's tally of 75,968 over the same time period.

Based on the epidemic curve, the DOH notes that cases on a weekly basis in 2024 went above what was observed in 2023 from January 1 to May 11. From May 12 to June 29, the weekly case numbers have returned to either below or just slightly above what was recorded in 2023.

This may be attributed to ongoing intensified efforts of local governments to kill mosquitoes by searching and destroying their breeding water.

Seven regions have shown an increase in cases over the past six weeks before June 29: MIMAROPA, Cagayan Valley, Western Visayas, Ilocos Region, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, and the National Capital Region.

The DOH does not release specific names of local governments to al-

low for their coordinated risk communication, community engagement, and response on localized Dengue outbreaks, as provided for under Section 7 of Republic Act No. 11332.

The DOH continues to reiterate the importance of sustained measures and interventions.

The Department reiterates that the '4S' strategy works to combat Dengue: Search and Destroy mosquito breeding grounds by eliminating stagnant water and their containers; Self-protection measures like insect repellent and wearing long-sleeved shirts and long pants; Seek early consultation with a doctor or health worker for any symptoms; and Support fogging or spraying in a local hotspot or outbreak areas where an increase in cases is registered.

"With rain comes the rise of Dengue. We know what works, and that is to kill mosquitoes. Protect loved ones too through clothing and mosquito repellants. Do not self-medicate; ask your doctor or nearby clinic if you have Dengue," said Health Secretary Teodoro J. Herbosa. Source: DOH
